Questions to ask organisations about your child's safety

Are your staff & volunteers police vetted & safety checked?

Organisations should be doing police vets and safety checks on people who are looking after your children.

Do you have a child protection policy?

A child protection policy guides people working with your children on how to keep them safe and respond to concerns.

Do you have a code of conduct?

A code of conduct will tell you the behaviour expected of staff and volunteers who are looking after your children.

Do you get children's input into your organisation's decisions?

Children need to be given a voice in the organisation, especially regarding their safety.

How do parents or children make complaints?

Children and parents need to know how to make a complaint. If they notice unsafe practice or they feel uncomfortable around a staff member or volunteer, they need to know who to tell and that there is a process to handle that.

Are your staff & volunteers trained in safeguarding & child protection?

Staff and volunteers should receive regular safeguarding and child protection training to ensure they can prevent, recognise and respond effectively to any abuse or neglect concerns.
